

Part 10: Israel's Exile Period

When God takes you out of your comfort zone



<u>Comfort Zones</u>: A "comfort zone" is a mental state in which an individual feels familiar, at ease, and without stress or anxiety. God often took people out of their comfort zone to bring them back to him or to strengthen their trust in him. These people included Moses, Jonah, Timothy, Gideon, and the entire Kingdom of Judah.

B. WHY GOD TOOK THE JEWS OUT OF THEIR COMFORT ZONE

- They abandoned God and worshipped idols.
- They adopted the customs and religions of their heathen nations.
- They practiced the Baal fertility cult.
- They worshipped Molech.
- They refused to pay tribute to Nebuchadnezzar.
- They were missing God's best for them

C. HOW BEING OUT OF THEIR COMFORT ZONE HELPED THEM

- They eventually saw the connection between being exiled and their violation of the Mosaic Law (Deuteronomy 28:25).
- They understood why the exile was 70 years (Lev . 25:1-7).
- It renewed their passion for obeying God.
