B. WHY CHRISTIANS ARE TO EXPLAIN THE GOSPEL

- Jesus commanded it (Mark 16:15).
- The gospel is God's power to save (Romans 1:16).
- People cannot believe unless someone tells them (Romans 10:14).
- We are ambassadors for Christ (2 Corinthians 5:20).
- The love of Christ compels us to share (2 Corinthians 5:14).

C. COMMON ATTITUDES OF UNBELIEVERS TOWARD SALVATION

- 54% believe they will go to heaven because they are "a good person." (Barna, 2023)
- 62% believe all religions teach basically the same thing. (Pew, 2022)
- 34% believe sin is a real problem that must be addressed. (Lifeway, 2022)
- 58% believe there is no absolute truth. (Barna, 2020)
- Nearly 70% have never had the gospel personally explained to them. (Wheaton, 2019)
