

Part 7: THE PERIOD OF THE JUDGES

The book of Judges covers 356 years between the conquest of the Promised Land and the uniting of the twelve tribes under a single king (Saul, David, Solomon). It describes the repeated six stages of Israel's apostasy, and how God graciously raised up a judge each time to deliver them from their enemies.

I. ISRAEL'S CYCLE OF DISOBEDIENCE



Israel's cycle of disobedience

A. Stage 1: Israel obeys God (Mosaic Law) and is blessed (cf. Deut. 28:1-14)

- 1. Israel lives in obedience to God and the Mosaic Law.
- 2. Israel experiences the blessings of the Mosaic Covenant (Deut. 28:1-14).

B. Stage 2: Israel disobeys God (Mosaic Law) and is cursed (cf. Deut. 28:15-25).

- 1. They didn't teach their children (Judges 2:10; cf. Prov. 22:6; Joel 1:3.
- 2. They intermarried with Canaanites.
- 3. They worshipped Canaanite gods.
- 4. <u>Question</u>: Would you say America is a godly nation today? If not, what things are, in a sense, worshipped in our nation today?
- 5. As a result of Israel's disobedience, it experienced the curses described in Deut. 28:15-68.

C. Stage 3: Israel is enslaved by other nations.

- 1. The Israelites had a much stronger army but fell to the sensual religion and practices of the Canaanites.
- 2. Much of the OT documents how Israel is defeated by other nations because of their disobedience (e.g., Assyrians, Babylonians, Greeks, Romans, etc.).
- 3. The good news, someday all Israel (believers) will be saved (Romans 11:26-27).

D. Stage 4: Israel repents.

- 1. Israel realizes their mistake and cries out to the Lord for deliverance from their oppressors (Judges 3:9, 15; 6:6; 10:10).
- 2. Each time Israel repented God raised a judge ("deliverer") to free Israel from its oppressors (Judges 3:9, 15).

E. Stage 5: God raises up a judge.

- 1. Cycle 1: Othniel (Judges 3:7-11).
- 2. Cycle 2: Ehud and Shamgar (Judges 3:12-30).
- 3. Cycle 3: Deborah and Barak (Judges 4:1-5:31).
- 4. Cycle 4: Primarily Gideon but including Tola and Jair (Judges 6:1—8:32).
- 5. Cycle 5: Jephthah, Ibzan, Elon, and Abdon (Judges 11:29-40; 12:8-15).
- 6. Cycle 6: Samson (Judges 13:1-21:25).

F. Stage 6: Israel is delivered.

- 1. God in his love and patience empowers these judges to deliver Israel from its oppressors.
- 2. Israel then enjoys peace for a period (Judges 3:11, 30; 5:31; 8:28)
- 3. Unfortunately, Israel then falls back into sin and idolatry and repeats this same cycle for a total of six times.
