PART 7: HOW DOES A SINNER BECOME RIGHT BEFORE A HOLY GOD?



Romans Chapter 4

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In Romans Chapter 4 Paul is anticipating the objections of Christian Jews who have been taught all their lives that Abraham was justified by his obedience to the law. The point Paul is making in Chapter 4 is that Abraham was declared righteous by God <u>before</u> he underwent the rite of circumcision, which is the mark of faithfulness to the Jews. Paul then explains that because Abraham believed God by faith before his circumcision, he is the father of both the uncircumcised (i.e. Gentiles who have faith in God) and the circumcised (the Jews). To

the Jewish mind this was heresy because they counted Abraham as only their father, which set them apart from the rest of the world.

A. MAIN IDEA

Sinners become right (justified) before a holy God by his grace, through faith, not by works.

B. KEY WORDS

- 1. <u>Faith</u> (Noun: Gk. *pistis*): Saving faith is believing that God is who he says he is, and will do what he said he will do. It is believing something in the absence of proof (Heb. 11:1).
- 2. Impute (KJV/NKJ, Gk. logizomai): to charge or credit to someone's account.
- 3. Righteousness (Gk. dikaioō): To be made right ("not guilty") before God; to be justified.
- 4. <u>Trust/believe</u> (Verb: Gk. *pisteuō*): A verbal form of faith; to have faith in God by believing him.
