SIX DEFINING CHARACTERISTICS OF TODAY'S CULTURE

1. Truth is based on personal opinions.
2. Biblical morality is no longer valued.
3. Marriage is becoming more obsolete.
4. Our government is seriously divided.
5. Technology has changed everything.
6. Christianity has become marginalized.



TWO BIG QUESTIONS

1. How are we as Christians to live in today's culture?
2. How can we evangelize a disinterested society?

WHY FIRST PETER?

1. It tells how to flourish in a declining American culture
 - He shows the importance of living holy lives in an immoral culture
 - He explains why we are to live holy lives
2. Peter's readers faced the same kind of social marginalization as we do
 - His readers were living in a pagan Roman culture
 - Christians were viewed with suspicion by non-Christians
3. It reveals why Christians are often despised
 - Christians are different
 - Christians God-centered while others are me-centered
 - Christians are often characterized in media as being "weird"
4. It explains how Christians are to face times of testing (trials)
 - Peter instructs us to look forward
 - He encourages us to base our hope on our eternal life
 - He shows us that living in today's culture is only temporary
5. It shows why the right kind of hope is so important for Christians today
 - Our hope is not in our government but in our God
 - Our hope is based on God's powerful promises, not wishful thinking
6. It helps Christians understand how to evangelize a post-Christian culture
 - Because people today are not interested in church, the church must go to them
 - The gospel is being taken to an indifferent culture through missional communities
