CASE STUDY

Types of Decisions

M. Blaine Smith ("Knowing God's Will) offers the following types of decisions and how to respond to them:

DECISION TYPE	DESCRIPTION	response
Straightforward moral decisions	Adultery, pornography, murder, stealing, idolatry, etc.	
Complicated moral decisions	Abortion, Christian response to war, capital punishment, etc.	
Complex decisions	Profession to choose, college to attend, whether to marry or not, what church to attend, how to spend your time and money.	
Gray area decisions	Smoking, drinking, dancing, gambling, movies, eating meat offered to idols.	
Straightforward nonmoral decisions	What shirt to wear, what foods to eat, hobbies to take up, etc.).	

SIX WAYS TO FIND GOD'S WILL

1.	Look for
	What does the Bible say about marriage, money, church, etc.
2.	Look for
	 These are often the two most obvious ways that God uses to reveal His will for you. For instance, if you apply for a job, and several turn down your application, you should probably conclude that God is closing doors and saying, 'No.'
3.	Look for
	 The inner witness is that ministry of the Holy Spirit in which He guides the believer through personal impressions, and inner peace within the heart, to reveal God's individual will.
	 "And the peace (inner rest, harmony, absence of anxiety) of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Phil. 4:7 NIV)
4.	When necessary, seek
	 God's individual will can be revealed through other mature, Bible-believing Christians whose walk is consistent with God's word.
	 However, the Holy Spirit is to be the final Counselor.
5.	Examine your
	 Our real desires will correspond perfectly to God's will when we are living in obedience to His Word.
6.	Use
	Sometimes you may feel that you are being led to do something which doesn't make sense to you.
	 Guidance, which appears to go against common sense, should be

followed only if the Lord gives you very clear and definite leading.
