II. WHY PRAY WHEN GOD KNOWS EVERYTHING?

Such branches are picked up and thrown into the fire and burned. But if you remain in Me [if you be dependent upon Me, express your trust in Me] and My words remain in you, you can ask whatever you wish and it will be given to you." John 15:5-7

B. Purpose No. 2: Prayer builds my _____ with Jesus.

"I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you <u>friends</u>, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit-- fruit that will last. Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in my name." John 15:15-16

C. Purpose No. 3: Prayer brings God's _____

"Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will receive, and your joy will be complete." John 16:24

I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father." John 14:11-13
