LESSON 3: TACTICS IN THE GARDEN

A. CENTRAL QUESTION

Why did God give Adam and Eve the ability to make independent decisions that could have devastating consequences?

B. THE TEXT: GENESIS 2:15—3:24

The narrative in Genesis 2:15—3:24 addresses themes of disobedience, consequences of sin, and the impact of the Fall on humanity's relationship with God. It sets the stage for the unfolding biblical story and the redemptive themes found in later passages.

Here is a summary of the key events in this passage:

1. Creation of Adam and Eve (Genesis 2:15-25)

God creates Adam and places him in the Garden of Eden. God recognizes that it is not good for Adam to be alone, so He creates Eve from one of Adam's ribs, establishing the first human pair. God commands Adam not to eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, warning that doing so will result in death.

2. The Serpent's Deception (Genesis 3:1-7)

The serpent deceives Eve by questioning God's command and suggesting that eating the forbidden fruit will make her like God. Eve succumbs to temptation, eats the fruit, and shares it with Adam.

3. Consequences and Accountability (Genesis 3:8-13)

Adam and Eve, realizing their disobedience, hide from God in the garden. When confronted by God, Adam blames Eve, and Eve blames the serpent.

4.	Pronouncement of Conseq	uences (Genesis 3:14-19	١

God pronounces consequences for the serpent, Eve, and Adam, including increased pain in childbirth, strained relationships, and hardships in work and sustenance.

5. Expulsion from the Garden (Genesis 3:20-24)

God expels Adam and Eve from the Garden of Eden to prevent them from eating from the tree of life and living eternally in their fallen state. God places cherubim and a flaming sword to guard the way to the tree of life.
