FAITH IN ACTION

PART 7: GOD, PLEASE BLESS MY PLANS!

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James writes, "Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money." How many times have you made plans like this without asking for God's will, or perhaps you made plans and then asked God to bless them?

It was the custom of ancient times to trade from city to city, carrying their goods on the backs of camels. The Jews made a practice of trading in Tyre, Sidon, Caesarea, Crete, Ephesus, Philippi, Thessalonica, Corinth, Rome, and more. It is to this kind of business life that James is describing.

A. THE BIG QUESTION



James reprimands his fellow Jews for making plans to go to different cities to carry on business and make money. So, was he saying that it is wrong to make plans? Should Christians not be good business people?

B. JAMES 4:13-16

"Now listen, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money." ¹⁴ Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. ¹⁵ Instead, you ought to say, "If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that." ¹⁶ As it is, you boast and brag. All such boasting is evil. James 4:13-16 (NIV)

C. BACKGROUND

New cities were being developed in Europe and North Africa at the time when James wrote his letter. Numerous opportunities to gain wealth were abundant,

and many Jew's, living outside Palestine, had enviable special talents as merchant businessmen.

Lucrative inducements were given to entice them to become citizens of their newly

established metropolitan centers, and in the process many Jews became very wealthy and influential people. James now writes to those scattered Christian Jews who were enjoying this new-found wealth and describes the proper attitude toward one's treasures, warning them about arrogantly planning their lives apart from seeking God's will.
